
Creative Writing Competition: -




Prinary 1

HISTORY


ICT


Science - Circuits & Conductors

In Science, children have learned about electricity and circuits; looking at how circuits work. They looked at the differences between mains and battery powered electricity, how to make a switch and which materials are conductors and which insulators. Children carried out lots of investigations and experiments such as making circuits to turn light bulbs on using more than one battery in a circuit.



History- the Mayans

In History, children looked at Mesoamerica, the land of the ancient Mayans. They explored this fascinating civilisation together, they found out where the Mayans lived, what their lives were like, and how their society was organised. They also investigated the evidence they left behind and uncovered some Mayan mysteries. The children enjoyed researching about the Mayans, as well as doing fun activities and games. They learned the rich culture and detailed overview of this period in Mesoamerican history.



Literacy- Ottoline & The Yellow cat

In Literacy, children read the story of Ottoline and the Yellow Cat, asking and answering questions and making predictions. They focussed on the characters' thoughts and feelings, and on the features of mystery stories. The children revised their knowledge of the different types of sentences and clauses. The writing tasks included writing a newspaper report, a postcard to Ottoline's parents and an extract from her notebook. For the final writing task, children focussed on the structure of mystery stories and created their own mystery stories about Ottoline and Mr. Monroe.
