#### Fiction:

# Friend or Foe- Evacuee Children

Children explore a fiction set in London and Devon. They use discussion and role play to explore characters and the impact of World War II. They develop editing, proof reading and peerreview skills. They plan, edit and write a story from different character's point of view.

#### Non-fiction: Animals On the Move

Children will explore through different literacy skills why animals need to be able to move and the variety of ways in which they do. They will examine and analyse in detail animal hunting techniques and migration patterns.



#### Maths

- •Place Value. Rounding digit numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and 10,000.
- •Four operations: written addition, subtraction, long division and long multiplication.
- •Common multiples, factors, prime numbers, squared and cube numbers.
- •Simplify and compare and order mixed number fractions including in problem solving.
- •Add and subtract mixed number fractions including in word problems.
